The speaker, Debbie Keeling, described her business, Bath Harvest Oils, which is based in Wilmington, a small hamlet near Newton St Loe. Debbie started her business in 2011 after hearing Chris Evans discussing rapeseed oil on his radio show. One hundred acres of the family's 650-700-acre farm have been planted with rapeseed, rotated annually to keep the soil healthy. Rapeseed is a member of the cabbage family! Debbie demonstrated different infused rapeseed oils

and mayonnaise, as well as soap made from rapeseed oil. She passed round chocolate brownies and lemon cake, also made from – you've got it – rapeseed oil. These are suitable for a gluten-free diet. Products were available to buy at the end of the talk.
