**Doynton Big Screen** will be back in the village hall for its final film of the season on Saturday February 24<sup>th</sup>, when there will be a showing of Andy Serkis's Breathe. Joy is a complicated emotion to capture on screen – particularly when your narrative deals with paralysis, imprisonment and a desire for death. Yet Andy Serkis's directorial feature debut, about the life of pioneering polio survivor Robin Cavendish, is so full of laughter that you might easily forget its sombre subject matter. Part exuberant love story, part great escape adventure, this is an old-fashioned tale of triumph over adversity that refuses – like its protagonists – to succumb to confinement. It stars Andrew Garfield as Cavendish and Claire Foy as his wife, Tom Holland as her twin brothers and Hugh Bonneville as the inventor of the machine that lets Robin escape from his iron lung.
