Newsletter Christmas 2012

One year on from the formation of Friends of Summers Field Ltd, we have planted 18 fruit trees, the Jubilee Oak and 4 benches, so it's starting to look much more like a Community Orchard - many thanks to those who have made donations and helped on the work parties.

We've also replaced the gate knocked down last year with a new full width one which should make the field secure from unauthorised vehicle entry. The large log that has served this purpose to date will be put to good use as an extra bench.

The Cider Fest held at the end of October proved to be very popular and was enjoyed by all, particularly the games organised by Lee Whitbread – he's had much practice in the Officers' Mess apparently. The event raised £487 which we will put towards the annual outgoings (about £1200 per year in rent, insurance, maintenance, etc).

Grants have also been secured from South Glos Council and Big Lottery Awards for All which will enable us to buy a ride-on mower, a secure shed to house it in, the remainder of the trees and seed for the wildflower meadow. These grants can only be used for the purposes specified by the donors though, so we will continue to need donations and membership fees to cover the annual outgoings. In that respect a response form is attached for anyone who would like to make a further donation or apply for/renew membership of the interest group (£10 per year).

Future plans are to plant the remainder of the fruit trees next Spring when we will also start work on the wildflower meadow.

Questions have been raised as to whether children will be allowed to play in the field now that trees have been planted. To dispel any doubts, for our part the management committee welcome children playing in the field which is a recreational facility intended for use by the whole community. However, the football pitch that had been set up on the far side of the field will obviously not be a practical proposition once trees have been planted there next Spring and the use of the field is anyway constrained by the terms of the licences granted to us by the council. Currently these restrict its use strictly to an orchard and wildflower meadow.
