## Chairman's Report 2018

We started 2018 with a very muddy car park, so we were forced to fence off the grass area. In the spring a repair to the sunken area was completed, which to date has been successful. The original a False Acacia was planted in memory of Honor Salmon (nee Pitman), who was killed in WW2.

The final event of the year was the Pop Up Village New Years Eve Party. It was well attended and the Old and New were celebrated in style with an American Supper, Disco extravaganza and the odd glass or two!!
